LOVETT ROAD DOG PARK USER SURVEY RESULTS


Survey Period: March 16 - 30, 2020



BREC conducted an online public survey from March 16 through March 30, 2020.


The charts that follow show characteristics of users of Lovett Road Park and will provide BREC staff with valuable information in terms of how the park is designed.

Of the 493 people who participated in the online survey for Lovett Road Dog Park, 305 of them were 35 years and older, 182 were between 18-34, 5 were between 12-17, and 1 was under 12 years of age.




Age Profile of Survey Respondents


How often do you currently visit Lovett Road Park?




Why do you visit dog parks?



How do you get to the Park?





How far do you travel to get to the park?

Sampling of Additional Comments and Suggestions:

- Consider separating different size dogs into separate areas.
- A small pond or swimming pond similar to Burbank Dog Park.
- Crushed stone could potentially get hot and burn a dog's feet.
- As little dirt as possible; keep dust/dirt to a minimum.
- All of the above-mentioned amenities sound wonderful!
- I don't visit dog parks as of now. I live in Central and would definitely use this one.
- Maybe a "gum dispenser" type machine where people can buy treats for dogs?
- Improvements like this would be a great incentive to keep using the park with my family.
- Have rules about when dogs should not be allowed and cleaning up after your dog.
- Plenty of running room and a division area for smaller dogs or dogs who are older.
- Rounded fencing no corners for dogs to get bullied into. Ball shooter. Dog wash area.
- Double gates to get in and out.
- Trash cans and plastic bags for doggie waste should be placed in the park.
- A separate small dog area would be good.
