Dear BREC families,

The BREC team is hard at work putting the finishing touches on plans to make the summer of 2023 one to remember. From our award-winning summer camps to free swimming lessons, paddling programs, woods walks and nature hikes, athletics clinics and even movies at Liberty Lagoon Water Park, something fun will happen in BREC parks every day.

Camp BREC registration is set for March 4, so mark your calendars now as many sessions fill up within the first few hours. This guide will help you build the perfect summer for your camper with camps offered in every part of the parish for easy drop-off and pick-up as well as a new bus stop option. We offer camps designed for nearly every interest such as animals, outdoor exploration, science, sports, theatre, art, history, astronomy and much more. As always, BREC is offering a robust scholarship program to make certain every child can have a safe, structured summer experience regardless of income or ability. We also have camps for teens and programs to train our next generation of summer counselors.

This guide also includes the schedule for Liberty Lagoon Water Park, BREC's splash pads and swimming pools. Programs and events include swimming lessons, special days that allow local first responders, seniors and children and adults with special needs to enjoy exclusive time in the water park. You'll also find a brand-new movie series which will offer extended evening hours in the water park and of course, the popular season-ending Pool Pawty for dog owners and their furry friends.

This is a pivotal year for BREC as many transformational construction projects are making substantial progress. You will be invited to celebrate new exhibits at the Zoo, a

transformed J.S. Clark Golf Course, a new, elevated recreation center and swimming pool at Howell Community Park, a new boat launch at Manchac Park and much more. Designs and construction will also begin as Airline Highway is turned into BREC's 13th Community Park, Bluebonnet Swamp and Perkins Road Community Parks receive new master plans through community input, construction on a trail to connect Scotlandville Parkway to Downtown will begin, the Lakes project will continue, and safe rooms to house first responders and double as state-of-the-art recreation centers will be built in the Memorial Stadium complex and Airline Community Park. These are just a few of the large-scale projects underway or in planning and as always, you can learn more by going to brec.org.

We invite you to work with us this year as BREC begins the lengthy process to create a new Imagine Your Parks strategic plan. Please keep an eye out for announcements as we hold public meetings and commission surveys across the parish to learn what you want to see next in your park system as we continue to work with you to create a modern park system that not only helps make our community healthier, but improves the environment, provides flood protection, offers safe spaces for bicyclists, runners and walkers, attracts visitors and makes our community a better place to live, work and play.

It is important that we also look back and recognize the progress that has been made since the first Imagine Your Parks plan was approved by the community in 2004, so look for a new web page that will show you how, together, we turned an aging park system into a gold medal champion in 18-years.

GENERAL SUMMER CAMP INFORMATION

REGISTRATION

Summer camp registration begins online Saturday, March 4 at 9 a.m. for all East Baton Rouge Parish residents. Out-of-parish residents may begin registering online or during regular facility hours of operation starting Tuesday, March 14.

You can register for all camp locations through WebTrac, BREC's online registration system, from your computer, tablet, or smartphone at webtrac.brec.org.

TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL ONLINE REGISTRATION

- All camp sessions are listed by location. Have your camp location chosen ahead of time so you only have to simply search by location or Camp Activity # which can be found by visiting brec.org/summercamp.
- Login to Webtrac before March 4 to make sure your information is up to date and that you are familiar with the layout and navigation. You will need Adobe Acrobat Reader to open these files.



- Know your user ID and password ahead of time. If you cannot remember it, use the "Forgot Password" or "Forgot Username" on the left side of the screen.
- Not sure if you have an account? Click "Contact Us" at the top of the screen to send a message with your Name, Address, Email Address and Phone Number or email staff directly at info@register.brec.org. BREC staff will get back to you as soon as possible.
- Never registered online before? Make your Webtrac account before March 4 by choosing "Create an Account" at the top of the screen.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

- Visa, MasterCard or Discover credit/debit card are accepted on webtrac.brec.org.
- To pay by check or cash, please visit your selected camp location to register during the facility's regular hours of operation beginning Sunday, March 5.

PARTIAL PAYMENT AVAILABLE: All summer camp sessions can be reserved ONLINE by East Baton Rouge Parish residents with a 50% payment of total session fees through Friday, April 28. Beginning Saturday, April 29, full payments for summer camp sessions are required at the time of registration. Other arrangements may be made by going into the camp location where you would like to register. Full payment must be received by the Thursday prior to camp.

SCHOLARSHIPS: East Baton Rouge Parish residents can apply for scholarship opportunities ONLINE with a 50% pre-payment of total session fees and by filling out the scholarship request form available during registration. Mark the "interested in scholarship" box to access the request form. BREC may provide scholarship assistance of 50% of the total fee due to those families who qualify by providing documentation of filed 2022 Federal Tax form 1040 or current SNAP benefits. The 2022 filed Tax Form must have the name of the person registering the camper(s) and it must have the camper(s) listed as dependents. Line 1 of the tax form must meet the federal/state poverty guidelines to qualify. To qualify using SNAP, proof of current benefits must be documented with the name of the person registering camper(s) and have the camper(s) names listed as dependents. Once a completed request and all correct documentation has been received you will be notified within ten business days if it has been accepted. - Scholarships are available on a first come, first served basis until funds are no longer available.
- Scholarships are not available for Baton Rouge Zoo and Tennis Camp sessions

SUMMER CAMP REFUNDS

Registrants must request all refunds on a 2023 Summer Camp Refund form which can be downloaded at brec.org/summercamp or picked up at your summer camp location. Completed forms must be emailed to summercamp@brec.org.

If a registrant requests a refund more than 10 business days prior to the start of the session, BREC will issue the full session fee minus a \$15 transaction fee. If a registrant requests a refund 10 business days or less from the start of the session, BREC will not issue a refund. All checks must clear the bank before BREC processes any refunds. BREC does not issue a refund for any session already in progress. Please allow 3-4 weeks for BREC to issue a refund after the refund form has been submitted. Addresses must be legible and up to date to avoid any delay with the refund process. Refunds will be distributed to the payee named on the BREC summer camp payment receipt.

ASSESSMENTS

All campers with a diagnosed disability must undergo an assessment with a BREC Adaptive staff member. The assessment must be completed prior to starting camp. Assessments are essential for our campers to have a successful experience at camp. Assessments are required prior to registration for all Sunshine Camps.

CAMP BREC BUS STOPS

This summer, Camp BREC is offering a brand-new transportation service for all Community Recreation camps to assist parents and guardians in getting their campers to the main camp location. Each camp location will offer one to three bus stops at nearby BREC parks for drop off and pick up each morning and evening of camp. Bus Stop locations will be chosen during the camp registration process but can be altered after the start of camp. Parents and guardians will be required to stay with his or her camper until the bus and camp counselor arrives for pick up. Each pavilion rental includes one auxiliary permit for use of dry inflatable, canopy/tent, or cooking apparatus. Auxiliary item and pavilions rental restrictions will be discussed at time of rental. If you are not renting a pavilion or want to add an additional auxiliary item, it is a \$10 non-refundable fee. Pavilion rentals may be requested on-site for small groups.

- Inflatable Rental Company must have BREC listed as co-insured with \$1 million liability coverage; a copy of the insurance policy must be included with the application.
- All Reservation must be done 14 days in advance
- \$100 separate refundable damage deposit check is required for all pavilion rentals.

Groups of 30 to 500 must have a pavilion rental agreement or apply for a special event permit. Large groups coming to enjoy one of our BREC parks must request permission 30 days in prior to the requested date. A non-refundable application fee of \$10 will apply for special event permit. Price and requirements for an approved special event is quoted within 15 days after submitting the application.

Groups of 500+ in size shall be limited to the following locations:

BREC’s Airline Hwy Fairgrounds, Zachary Community Park or Highland Road Community Park (Grand Pavilion and Great Lawn) unless prior permission is granted to hold the event. Renter must come into the main office on Florida Blvd. to reserve these facilities.
