HEARTS & HOOVES - Therapeutic Riding Program Farr Park Equestrian Center 6402 River Road, Baton Rouge 70820 This program provides equine-oriented activities for the purpose of contributing to the cognitive, physical, emotional and social well-being of people with disabilities. The center welcomes adults and children, ages six and older, to participate in sessions throughout the school year every Monday at 4:30 or 6 p.m. Volunteers serve as "side walkers" as they lead the horses through the arena and trails to ensure the safety of participants. Experience with horses is **NOT** required. The fall semester classes run **September 11 - October 16** and **October 30 - December 4**.

GOLF MARSHALS AND STARTERS

Dumas Memorial Golf Course 13350 Hwy. 19, Baker Flexible Scheduling Daily

LLocated in Greenwood Community Park, this course is approximately 15 minutes from downtown Baton Rouge. One of the best places to golf in Baton Rouge, this course is an 18-hole layout measuring 6,596 yards. BREC is seeking volunteer golf marshals and starters to help with this incredible course. Marshals are known as the course rangers and help manage the flow around the golf course. Starters are needed to help control the pace of play on the golf course by directing players to the first tee at appropriate times. Golf volunteers may qualify for reduced playing fees.
