Trot over to BREC's Farr Park for Hearts and Hooves We're keeping pace this fall with Hearts and Hooves

BREC's Farr Park Equestrian Center is currently hosting their annual fall therapeutic riding program for children and adults with multiple different disabilities, and our volunteers are rocking it! The first session of the program began on September 11 and will wrap up on October 16. Volunteers started their afternoon by learning how to lead and saddle the horses, after they each led a horse from the stables to the equestrian gymnasium. Once the participants arrived, the session was underway with stretching, games and a trail walk around the park to enjoy the beautiful afternoon.

Hearts and Hooves provides one-on-one equine-oriented activities for the purpose of contributing to the cognitive, physical, emotional and social well-being of those with disabilities. Farr Park instructor, Filia Wappas, describes the program as, "one of the best Farr Park has to offer." She states, "the program allows people with mental and/or physical disabilities to be able to enjoy equestrian therapy and allows them to feel that sense of joy and accomplishment that comes with riding. It also helps just give our participants an outlet to become stronger physically and emotionally, while spending time with these amazing animals."

While focused on the participants, this is beneficial to our volunteers as well. Filia explained volunteers as being a HUGE part of why Farr Park is able to accomplish what they do. "We get a range of people from seasoned horse people to people with no experience at all. The ones who have no experience we teach them the basics of going to get a horse, grooming, tacking, leading, etc. The more experienced volunteers are usually horse lovers that just want to spend extra time around horses.

There are some participants that need a little extra help since they may not be

able to balance in the saddle, for instance, so we will assign a volunteer or to walk alongside the horse and rider to make sure the rider stays safe and to give encouragement."

The next fall session happens October 30 - December 4 every Monday at 4:30pm and 6:00pm. Volunteers are not required to have any experience with horses or riding. So, come lend a hand a be a part of

HEARTS & HOOVES - Therapeutic Riding Program

Farr Park Equestrian Center 6402 River Road, Baton Rouge 70820

This program provides equine-oriented activities for the purpose of contributing to the cognitive, physical, emotional and social well-being of people with disabilities. The center welcomes adults and children, ages six and older, to participate in sessions throughout the school year every Monday at 4:30 or 6 p.m. Volunteers serve as "side walkers" as they lead the horses through the arena and trails to ensure the safety of participants. Experience with horses is NOT required. The fall semester classes run September 11 - October 16 and October 30 - December 4.

GOLF MARSHALS AND STARTERS

Located in Greenwood Community Park, this course is approximately 15 minutes from downtown Baton Rouge.
