THE NUMBERS ARE IN!

The numbers are in, and it was another stellar year for Volunteer BREC! We would like to thank the 4,247 volunteers who provided 36, 868.75 hours of service to BREC in 2016! According to Independent Sector.org, the value of a volunteer in Louisiana is \$23.56 per hour. This means the value provided by BREC volunteers in 2016 totaled \$868,627.75! We hope that the volunteers' experience was invaluable.

Just under 550 volunteers contributed 1,511 hours helping keep BREC parks aesthetically pleasing through beautification projects. We would like to thank the various high school and collegiate groups who spent their free time and even spring break helping make BREC parks clean and pristine in 2016.

While Bluebonnet Swamp saw the most volunteers - 1, 444 to be exact - put in 4,867 hours, 90 golf marshals put in the most hours at 14,641. The BREC Zoo had 1,250 volunteers contribute 8,689 hours to help with major events such as Zippity Zoo Fest. With so many community events put on by BREC's Recreation Department each year, it's no surprise that 363 volunteers put in 1,157 hours in 2016. Conservation had 174 volunteers work on projects that totaled 696 hours. That's almost 700 hours dedicated to helping the environment!

Magnolia Mound kept busy with 20 volunteers donating 895 hours of service throughout the year. Outdoor Adventure saw 41 volunteers spend 608 hours making sure kids and adults enjoyed the great outdoors! Sixty-four volunteers donated 246 hours to help with Extreme Sports & Dog Parks while 36 volunteers spent 108 hours helping humans and horses at Farr Park.

This year proved to be unlike any other in recent history with the August 2016 flood. BREC didn't miss a beat in reaching out to the community by setting up BREC on the Geaux at shelters and opening camps for those who were displaced. All in all, 54 volunteers gave 180 hours of their time at BREC to help those affected by the flood.

Between the various BREC committees and the BREC Foundation, 99 volunteers donated 349 hours of service. Other groups who had less than 20 volunteers each still made a huge impact with nearly 3,000 hours of service to BREC. These groups include Adult Leisure, Baton Rouge Soccer Club, BREC Commission, Fitness, Health Fairs, Highland Road Observatory, Independence Botanic Gardens, LSU Playground Kids, Photography and Youth Coaching.
